ARIZONA SUPREME COURT

To remove the MEMBERS OF THE ARIZONA SUPREME COURT who voted to uphold a dangerous 1864 total abortion ban, which mandates 2-5 years prison time for those who help someone access an abortion, vote NO for:

STATE BALLOT INITIATIVES

This portion of your ballot is going to seem jarring and long! Here's the straightforward lowdown: almost every proposition is a NO except Proposition 139, we like her, she's a YES.

Most of these propositions essentially harm people, give way more power to Republican-led state legislatures, or suppress votes one way or the other. Let's make informed decisions that align with our progressive values, friends!

PROPOSITION 133 (NO!)



This would mandate separate party-based primaries for partisan offices, outlaw mixed-party primaries, and have state election laws override local rules. Yup, they are trying to put all those different things into one ballot question. We've seen MAGA politicians in Arizona try to steal elections before, let's not give them control over local elections.

PROPOSITION 134 (NO!)

This would change how signatures are collected for ballot initiatives, basically requiring signatures from every single legislative district rather than just statewide. Ballot initiatives are how Arizona has made so much progress — 2016's Minimum Wage and Paid Leave measure is a shining example! — so it's no surprise a small minority wants to make it harder to pass a ballot. Vote NO.

PROPOSITION 135 (NO!)

This would allow the Republican-led state legislature to end a state of emergency or change the Governor's emergency powers, with emergency powers expiring automatically after 30 days unless extended by the legislature. Exemptions to this are only for war, flood, or fire emergencies. Vote NO.

PROPOSITION 136 (NO!)

This measure would allow legal challenges to be made against proposed constitutional amendments or initiative measures at least 100 days before an election. Vote NO.

PROPOSITION 137 (NO!)

This measure would eliminate term limits for state supreme court justices and superior court judges, replacing them with infinite terms of "good behavior" unless a judicial review commission decides otherwise. Hard pass, vote NO.

PROPOSITION 138 (NO!)

This allows employers to pay tipped workers 25% less than the minimum wage if their total tips aren't less than the minimum wage + \$2/hour. Absolutely not. We're fighting for a living wage for every Arizonan. Vote NO.



WE'VE GOT A WINNER.....IT'S ABOUT DAMN TIME! THIS AMENDMENT WAS PUT ON THE BALLOT BY THE PEOPLE. IT ESTABLISHES THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT TO ABORTION AND PROHIBITS STATE INTERFERENCE UP TO THE POINT OF FETAL VIABILITY. VOTE YES!

PROPOSITION 140: ELIMINATE PARTISAN PRIMARIES AMENDMENT (NO!)

Eliminate partisan primaries and replace them with an electoral system where individuals may vote for the candidate of their choice, regardless of the party affiliation of the voter or the candidate



PROPOSITION 311 (NO!)

This would introduce a \$20 fee on all criminal convictions to fund a \$250k benefit for the families of first responders killed in the line of duty. Vote NO.



This would allow property owners to apply for a tax refund if their local governments fail to enforce certain public order laws against things such as loitering, panhandling, or public consumption of alcohol. Vote NO.



PROPOSITION 313 (NO!)

This provides for sentencing for anyone convicted of involvement in child sex trafficking to go from up to 24 years in prison to life imprisonment. Vote NO.

PROPOSITION 314 (NO!)

This would allow state and local police to arrest noncitizens who cross the border unlawfully, allow state judges to order deportations, mandate e-verify for public employment, and classify the sale of fentanyl resulting in death as a major felony. As friends of immigrants, this one is going to be a hell NO.



PROPOSITION 315 (NO!)

This measure would block any new rule estimated to increase regulatory costs by \$500k within five years unless the state legislature approves it. Vote NO.

TOGETHER WE WILL
